## From the President..... Lynne Hartung



To the members of the NvFRW:

I would like to welcome our new NvFRW members—Mesquite Republican Women. The charter was submitted to National, after a unanimous vote at the Spring Board meeting. We hope to get to meet you all very soon.

The Board of Directors held the Spring meeting in Reno, May 14th-15th. We welcomed our guest, Rae Chernecky, NFRW 1st Vice President, who is a member of the Arizona Republican Women. Rae, of course, talked about Arizona's new immigration law, as well as about what it means to be a member of the NFRW.

Thanks to all of you who attended and participated. For those of you who could not attend, the Board approved the following:

- ▶ The Fall Board of Directors meeting will be held at the Green Valley Resort on September 15th-16th. Hotel room rates will be \$95 plus applicable taxes.
- ▶ In order to stimulate attendance at the Fall Board of the Directors meeting, the Board approved a registration fee of \$40 for all attendees of the meeting. The difference between the \$40 and the actual cost of the meeting will be paid by the NvFRW.
- ▶ Approved the revocation of the

charter of Republican Women of Henderson as a result of not meeting the requirements of the NvFRW bylaws—did not maintain a minimum of ten (10) members, nor hold the required minimum number of meetings annually.

Since the last newsletter, I attended my first NFRW Board of Directors meeting, which was held in Oklahoma City, in March. I didn't quite know what to expect but, as always, Republican women made me feel as though I had been attending forever. This year, of all the State Federations, 29 of the State Presidents are new to that position, which made the Presidents' Roundtable quite exciting. The annual budget was approved for the NFRW, and I brought it back with me for those of you who are interested in reviewing it. The NFRW meeting is in September in Charleston, So. Carolina. It is my hope some of you will consider attending.

By the time this newsletter goes out, the primary will be over and the general election campaigns will have started. As always, we will be hard at work supporting our Republican candidates. The women of our organization are the backbone of the Republican Party—in Nevada and throughout the United States. We volunteer our time, money, and efforts to support the Republican Party. Thank you all for all you do.

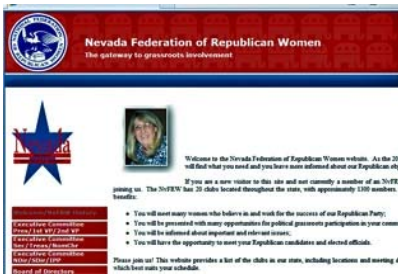

## Legislative Report

### Legislative Report—2nd Quarter

NvFRW legislative priorities for 2010 are voter fraud, Katie's Law and informing members about Special Legislative Sessions.

Katie's Law requires DNA tests for all felony arrests to help catch serial offenders. In the 2009 75<sup>th</sup> Legislative Session, Assemblywoman Heidi Gansert sponsored a Nevada Katie's Law bill which died due to its projected cost. Even though she is not running for re-election, she has reworked the bill and submitted a bill draft. She will make sure that it gets picked up by legislators that will support it and move it through the upcoming legislative session.

Voter Fraud - The ACORN and Amy Busefink trial is now scheduled for July. In May 2009, Nevada's Attorney General and Secretary of State filed criminal charges in the Las Vegas Justice Court against ACORN and two of its employees for compensating their employees to register voters based upon a corporate mandated quota system. The other employee had previously pleaded guilty, was sentenced to up to 3 years' probation and will testify in the July trial. This happened in our "back yard". Volunteer to help your county Republican party get information to the County Registrar to ensure accuracy of voter registration lists for residents and addresses in your neighborhood.

Nevada's Real ID – The Legislative Committee did not consider and, thus, did not extend the DMV's temporary regulation to implement Real ID in Nevada. Invasion of privacy, expansion of federal government control and cost are some of the concerns raised about implementation of Real ID for Nevada. The Nevada Senate had passed SB52 Real ID in 2009 which the Assembly did not act upon. In December 2009, Governor Gibbons issued an order that gave the DMV the authority to develop regulations and implement Real ID in Nevada for a 120 day temporary period, which ended May 2010. The Legislative Commission would have had to approve the regulations to extend the DMV program. Several organizations and many citizens spoke in opposition to the DMV's regulations and Real ID at the DMV and Legislative Subcommittee hearings held in April and early May. It can make a difference when you let your legislators know your opinions.

Healthcare Reform - On May 14th, Nevada became the 20<sup>th</sup> state to officially join the Florida federal lawsuit against Health Care Reform. The lawsuit alleges that the new law exceeds the Congressional powers of the United States granted under Article I of the Constitution by mandating that all citizens and legal residents have qualifying health care coverage or pay a tax penalty. Additionally, the tax penalty required under the law constitutes an unlawful direct tax in violation of Article I, sections 2 and 9 of the Constitution. Also, the lawsuit claims that the new law infringes on the sovereignty of the states and 10<sup>th</sup> Amendment by imposing operating rules that a state must follow as well as requiring the state to spend additional dollars without providing funds or resources to cover the cost of implementation.

It is looking more promising for Republicans to be able to gain enough seats to prevent funding the implementation of the healthcare reform bill until a Republican president can be elected in 2012, who would sign a bill to repeal healthcare reform. Help elect Republicans to local, state and national offices. Record your hours on the "Campaign Volunteer Award Tally Sheet" to help your club and NvFRW receive the NFRW Campaign Award.

## Nevada Constitution Project

The NvFRW has authorized me to move ahead in our efforts to provide every 5<sup>th</sup> grader in the State of Nevada with a copy of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution by September 17<sup>th</sup>, which is Constitution Day. The intent is to reach our youth with the documents on which our Country was founded. The cost of this project is \$1.00 per student, plus shipping charges.

With the help and efforts of Mr. Andy McKean of the Liberty Day project, we have the opportunity to provide a packet for each student and a Teacher's Guide which has the lesson plan, 24 Questions & Answers, as well as Teacher Evaluation Forms. We are also hoping to involve local attorneys, who would be willing to go into classrooms on that day to talk about the Constitution.

We are currently awaiting two items in order to proceed:

1. A letter of endorsement from Dr. Keith Rheault, the Commissioner in Nevada for the Dept. of Education, for you to take into your local schools.
2. A letter of support from the Nevada Bar Association, and, hopefully, help with recruiting attorneys. Both of these entities have all the supporting documentation they have requested, including endorsements from other

states who participated in this effort in 2009.

Liberty Day has completed a Community Grant Application with WalMart, since it is a 501(c)(3) non profit organization. It is authorized to give up to \$5,000.00, but typically will give \$1,000.00. Andy told me he can email or fax the package to those who are interested in going to their local WalMart and/or Sam's Club for funding.

I am also hoping that if any club has problems raising the funds for the schools near them that they may apply to the NvFRW for funds to help the project.

It's a big project, but I think it's essential for the future of the United States to teach our youth these principles; however, I will need the help of all the clubs to get this done.

Application forms for the Jo Marshall Scholarship may be obtained from the President of any club affiliated with the Nevada Federation of Republican Women or by contacting the scholarship chairman. The applicant must be female, a Nevada resident and a registered Republican. She must be attending or be accepted to attend a Nevada college or university. The President or First Vice President of the sponsoring club must sign her application.

Any applicant must have a minimum 3.3 GPA and must have carried 12 credit/hours during the last semester of school, whether high school or college. Grades or hours cannot be combined from two different sessions of school (i.e., a spring semester and summer school combined to apply for a fall award).

A club President or First Vice President, denoting sponsorship of the applicant must sign her application. The Executive Board of each respective sponsoring club should approve sponsorship. The applicant must then submit her completed application, two (2) letters of recommendation (these may be from a teacher, minister, businessperson or employer), and a personal goal statement, emphasizing her need for this scholarship. The applicant must request that the most recent school attended send copy of her latest transcript to the scholarship chairman no later than August 15, 2010 at the address listed above.

Two (2) awards will be made under the scholarship. One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) will be awarded on a one-time basis only to two (2) first place students, one from northern Nevada and one from southern Nevada. Only one award of \$1,000.00 per student will be given. Whether an applicant is to be considered for an award in the north or south is determined by where she resides, not where she plans to attend college. The scholarship checks will be sent directly to the Bursar or financial aid office at the respective schools of the five scholarship recipients to be put on account for their educational expenses.

The deadline for all items (application, two (2) letters of recommendation, a statement of personal goals and most recent transcript) is to be received by the scholarship chairman for consideration is August 15, 2010, without exception.

Applicants are encouraged to contact the scholarship chairman by telephone or email if they have any questions or require further information. However, no applications or supporting documents will be accepted by email. Official transcripts must be mailed directly to the chairman from the applicant's school office. Requesting such transcripts is the sole responsibility of the applicant.

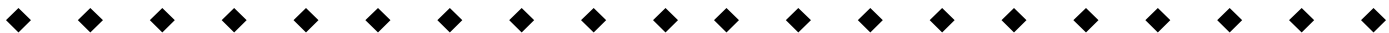

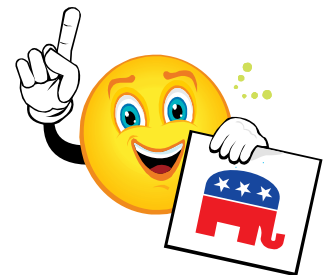
